### A Crash Course in Pronouns

with Sydney Brouillard-Coyle (Ney/Nem/Nir) author of A Pocket Guide to Pronouns

Pronouns are words that are used to refer to individuals. when talking to or about them - essentially, a set of words to replace the use of someone's name. Using someone's correct pronouns is a way to show respect, to honour each individual's dignity, and to create an inclusive environment.

### They/Them/Theirs

- They/them pronouns have been used singularly ever since 1375
- People frequently use they/ them pronouns (often unconsciously) when the gender of the person is unknown
- They/them is the most common gender-neutral pronoun in the English language

### Mixed/Multi Pronouns

- Some people may use a combination of different pronouns
- Common examples include she/they, they/he, or all pronouns
- If you know someone who uses multi/mixed pronouns, check in with them about how to use those pronouns!

## Neopronouns

- Neopronouns are any pronoun set developed between the 19th century and the present day.
- Though the prefix "neo" typically means "new", some neopronouns have existed since as early as the 1800s.
- Neopronouns are typically regarded as being gender neutral. These are less common pronoun sets, but neopronouns are completely valid!
- Examples of common neopronoun sets include (but aren't limited to): ey/em, fae/faer, ney/nem, per/per, ze/zir.





## The History

## of Pride

### 1969

Homosexuality officially decriminalized.

### 1970

University of Western Ontario Homophile Association (UWOHA) formed

### 1973

Homosexuality no longer considered a "disorder" with removal from Diagnostics and Statistics Manual of Mental Disorders.

### 1974

UWOHA moves off Campus and incorporates as Homophile Association of London Ontario (HALO)

### 1978

The Immigration Act of 1976 comes into effect this new amended Act lifted a ban prohibiting homosexuals from immigration.

### **FEBRUARY 5, 1981**

Toronto Bathhouse Raids Operation SOAP

### **MAY 1981**

First Lesbian Pride March Vancouver

### 1981

First solidarity picnic copresented by Western Gay Association & Metropolitan Community Church

### May 17, 1990

World Health Organization (WHO) voted to remove 'homosexuality' from designation as mental disorder in the 10th revision of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases

and Related Health Problems (ICD-10).

### **JUNE 27, 1990**

The term Two Spirit (niizh manidoowag) is coined at the third annual Native American/First Nations Gay and Lesbian Conference in Winnipeg.The term allows Indigenous LGBTQ+ folks to reject other English terms that impose the Western views of gender and sexuality on indigenous people.

### 1992

Rainbow Pride Bus First Pride Art Show

### 1992

Sexual Orientation read into the Human Rights Code.

### 1994

20th Anniversary of HALO/ Pride Celebration Marion Boyd, Attorney General at the time, spoke at celebration

### 1995

Diane Haskett refused a Gay Pride Proclamation First Pride March which turned into a protest Sue Barnes, MP for London West, spoke at celebration about changes to

the Human Rights Act

### May 27 1995

Same sex couples gain legal right to adopt Ontario

### 1996

Pride London Committee Formed

### **JAN 1, 1997**

Counting Past 2 Trans Arts Festival

1997 — 2002 in Toronto, Ontario. It was founded in 1997 by activist/artist Mirha-Soleil Ross, in recognition of the distinctive cultural and economic situation of trans communities. The festival's goal was to be more inclusive and encouraging of trans artists than mainstream gay and lesbian film festivals by centering trans voices, accepting less-polished work and including cabaret and performance components instead of restricting submissions to films.lt was the first festival of it's kind in the North America, and thought to be the first in the world.

### 1997

Ontario Human Rights Commission fined Diane Haskett and City of London for the refusal of the Gay Pride Proclamation request in 1995.

### 1997

Opening of Pride Library at Western University.

### 1998

A proclamation was issued by the City The march moved onto the street

### 2003

Pride London Festival Incorporated

### **JUNE 10, 2003**

Same Sex Marriage Legalized in Ontario

### 2005

Bill C-35-8 Federal Law that gave same sex couples the right to marry

### 2007

First time Pride Flag flown at City Hall

### 2008

First time the Parade was televised on Rogers TV hosted by Kathleen Holland and Martin Withenshaw

### 2009

Toronto's first Trans March

### 2011

First time Mayor of London in Pride Parade

### 2012

Pride London Festival moves to Victoria Park

### 2015

20th Annual Pride Parade

### 2016

25th Annual Art Show

### JUNE 1

First time the pride flag is raised on Parliament Hill

### **JUNE 2017**

Bill C-17

Human Rights Code to include "Gender Identity" and "Gender Expression"

### **DEC 2017**

Ontario Government officially marks TDOR

(Trans Day of Remembrance)

### **MAY 2019**

WHO declares Transgender is NOT mental disorder

### **DEC 2020**

The Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police issue a formal apology to the community

for their opposition to decriminalizing homosexuality in the late 60's \*note: this was a generalized blanket apology for ALL of Canada. This action was not SPECIFIC to London, Ontario\*

### **JUNE 2020**

BLM rally in Victoria Park

### 2022

London Police Chief makes public apology for officers Deadnaming a Trans

for officers Deadnaming a Trans Activist who was the victim of swatting and commits to additional training of the police force.

### 2023

Policies are set in place limiting trans rights in schools in Saskatchewan and New Brunswick
