We acknowledge that the Pride London Festival operates on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabek (Uh-nish-in-ah-bek), Haudenosaunee (Ho-den-no-show-nee), Lūnaapéewak (Len-ah-pay-wuk) and Attawandaron (Add-a-won-da-run).

We acknowledge all the treaties that are specific to this area: the Two Row Wampum Belt Treaty of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy/Silver Covenant Chain; the Beaver Hunting Grounds of the Haudenosaunee NANFAN Treaty of 1701; the McKee Treaty of 1790, the London Township Treaty of 1796, the Huron Tract Treaty of 1827, with the Anishinaabeg, and the Dish with One Spoon Covenant Wampum of the Anishnaabek and Haudenosaunee.

This land continues to be home to diverse Indigenous peoples (First Nations, Métis and Inuit) whom we recognize as contemporary stewards of the land and vital contributors to society. We hold all that is in the natural world in our highest esteem and give honor to the wonderment of all things within Creation. We bring our minds together as one to share good words, thoughts, feelings and sincerely send them out to each other and to all parts of creation. We are grateful for the natural gifts in our world, and we encourage everyone to be faithful to the natural laws of Creation.

The three Indigenous Nations that are neighbours to London are the Chippewas of the Thames First Nation; Oneida Nation of the Thames; and the Munsee-Delaware Nation who all continue to live as sovereign Nations with individual and unique languages, cultures and customs.

This Land Acknowledgement is a first step towards reconciliation. It is the work of all citizens to step towards decolonizing practices and bringing our awareness into action. We encourage everyone to be informed about the traditional lands, Treaties, history, and cultures of the Indigenous people local to their region.



Letter from Our President

We started our board year in November of 2024 with a completely new board, one director in place from earlier in the year and 2 returning from past years. Different from previous years, a completely new mandate, Bylaws updates, plans for regular organizational general meetings, a defined catchment, and most importantly, an expansion of the board of directors to a maximum of 11 members, with aspirations to hold space for the more marginalized members of our community to feel comfortable in joining as board members in the future.

We had a rocky start, the 2 departing board members from the 2024 board having been caretakers over an organization whose survival was debated. The departure of 3 directors in August left the remaining 3 below a threshold to function.

Rolling up our sleeves, we set to work, updating business registries, memberships, recovering access to social media accounts that were lost, reviewing financials and grants, while equally working to reconcile broken relationships, and develop new ones.

April 2nd, we held our first ever general meeting outside of the traditional once yearly Annual General Meeting, but were not able to get a majority of members to attend, most likely unaware of the obligations one has to participate when taking out a membership. By April 30th, we were able to hold a special meeting with the slimmest of margins for quorum (2 members over the required 50% +1), but in doing so, were able to fill all 11 Directors positions, a first for the London Pride Festival!

It was a year of first, the first Trans Woman to lead the organization, and broad gender representation, 3 of our board identify as having Indigenous ancestry, and we have newcomers to Canada represented as well. Our goal is to continue to diversify this representation, not by selecting or tokenizing, but by leading by example, and holding space for all of the diverse members of our community.

This year's annual festival will feel familiar, events leading up to a weekend of music and entertainment on July 18th, 19th and 20th, and culminating with our Annual Pride Parade July 20th

We were able to have small Winter and Spring celebrations, and are working on expanding to other events throughout the year. During the festival, we will be seeking your input, but more than anything, recognizing all of the hatred and strife directed towards our community, we hope you have a small respite to be your authentic selves, supported in a safe inclusive environment.

Finally, we selected our 2025 theme in April, **Prouder, Stronger, United!** It's a statement, a vision and a call to action, and as we come together to celebrate our Pride Week, I hope this message resonates with you, emboldens you to be seen, and empowers you to be kind and inclusive to one another.

Over the past year, there has been a complete changeover in composition of the Pride London Festival Board of Directors. Last year, the previous Board established a two-year plan for 2024-2025. The new Board has been working towards fulfilling that two-year mandate. While there is more work to be done, we are pleased to highlight our accomplishments so far.



TECHNOLOGY | WEBSITE REVAMP

Develop a refined and user-friendly website that caters to patrons, sponsors, and members. The website should be informative, easy to navigate, and accessible.

COMMUNITY PROMOTION | EVENT HUB

Utilize the website to become a central hub for promoting events happening throughout London's 25 LGBTQ+ community. This will foster collaboration and cross-promotion between organizations.

BOARD SUPPORT | COMMITTEE EXPANSION

Establish additional committees to support the Board of Directors in specific areas. This could include committees dedicated to social media management, marketing, fundraising, and volunteer coordination.



The website has been moved to the WordPress platform and has undergone a complete revamp with more to come.



Our webmaster has incorporated the Queeraoke calendar and is adding community events to the calendar on an ongoing basis.




The Pride Board was increased to 11 positions this year to support festival planning, ensure continuity of operations, lead committees, and expand community participation.



Sista Patricia Derouin

Sista Patricia Derouin, a fierce and beloved elder in the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, has dedicated her life to activism, protection, and connection. At 71, she is a powerful reminder that the fight for justice and equity knows no age limit. This year, Pride London Festival proudly honours Sista Patricia as the 2025 Grand Marshal, a role befitting her decades of unwavering advocacy and grassroots leadership.



Patricia's activism has spanned generations, from rallies for reproductive rights on Parliament Hill to today's frontline defence of 2SLGBTQIA+ rights. She now lives just outside the London-Middlesex area and was recognized with the 2023 Ken Sadler Pride Award for her exceptional work in improving the lives of London's queer and Two-Spirit communities.

Among her most impactful contributions is the creation of the Drag Storytime Guardians, a province-wide network that protects drag performers, families, and children from anti-LGBTQ+ hate. Born from a confrontation with aggressive protestors at a children's event in Parkhill, Ontario, the Guardians now boast nearly 1,000 members who regularly show up to defend safe, inclusive spaces. Patricia stepped away from her beloved WindSisters motorcycle club to devote herself entirely to this vital work, showing up in her signature battle vest covered in community patches—a symbol of solidarity, visibility, and protection.

A proud Butch lesbian, Sista Patricia sees herself as both protector and mentor. Despite battling cancer, she continues to stand at the front lines, unafraid to face threats or harassment from hate groups, and unwilling to let fear silence her. Her activism isn't just outward-facing; she challenges the queer community to heal internal divisions and listen across generations. She urges older generations to uplift youth, especially trans and nonbinary individuals, and to honour their evolving identities and struggles.

Patricia's motto—"The only mind I am responsible for opening is my own"—embodies her approach: lead with love, learn with humility, and protect with fierce resolve. As she leads this year's parade on her motorcycle, she carries with her the strength of decades of activism, the voices of those she protects, and the dream of a united, inclusive future.





What Does Two-Spirit Mean?

“Two-Spirit” is a term used within some Indigenous communities, encompassing cultural, spiritual, sexual and gender identity. The term reflects complex Indigenous understandings of gender roles, spirituality and the long history of sexual and gender diversity in Indigenous cultures.

Individual terms and roles for Two-Spirit people are specific to each nation.



The creation of the term Two-Spirit (also referred to as 2-Spirit or Two-Spirited) is widely considered to have been birthed from the Third Annual Inter-Tribal Native American, First Nations, Gay and Lesbian American Conference in Winnipeg in 1990 and was proposed by Elder Myra Laramee.

The term originates from a translation of the Anishinaabemowin phrase “Niizh Manidoowag” meaning “two spirits” and is a pan-Indigenous term used throughout English-speaking communities on Turtle Island.

While Two-Spirit is widely used today, others may prefer a Nation-specific term, as many Indigenous languages contain words that capture the gender diversity traditionally found in their communities.

While Two-Spirit and LGBTQ+ may overlap, they are not the same thing.

So, what's the difference?

Two-Spirit

An Indigenous term for Indigenous people who do not conform to rigid colonial gender or sexuality. Two-Spirit people draw from both the masculine and feminine sides of gender and spirit. Two-Spirit identity can not exist outside of Indigenous identity, and is often embraced through traditional roles in one's community.

LGBTQ+

A Western umbrella term for any person who does not identify as heterosexual or cisgender. Encompasses a wide variety of gender and sexuality expression. Anyone can identify as part of the LGBTQ+ community regardless of race. Some Indigenous people identify as Two-Spirit, but not LGBTQ+.


